About The Thomas Peterpaul Foundation

The Thomas Peterpaul Foundation was created in honor of Thomas F. Peterpaul who passed away at the age of 11 from complications associated with his battle with leukemia and a stem cell transplant. TPF originated to generate awareness of the battles pediatric cancer patients, like Thomas, face, and to inspire people to show their love and support for patients afflicted with this horrendous disease.

To date TPF has impacted many lives and hopefully inspired many people. Some examples of the beneficiaries of TPF's fundraising include: a major grant to the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia to support its ongoing research into pediatric leukemia; medical treatment for children with pediatric cancer; transportation to and from treatment; payment of housing expenses, including mortgages, rent, electrical, telephone and gas bills for families impacted by childhood cancer; purchase of mattresses and air conditioners to make life easier for families. Many area hospital patients have benefited from TPF's work including, Monmouth Medical Center, Hackensack University Hospital, Morristown Memorial Hospital, Robert Wood Johnson Hospital, New York Presbyterian Hospital and Children's Hospital of Philadelphia.
